**Aquaria Water Pipeline Project Area-Wide Roadway Restoration
Begins Week of October 27, 2008**

DIGHTON, MA—October 27, 2008— The contractor for the Aquaria Water Pipeline Project, P. Gioioso & Sons, Inc., of Hyde Park, MA, will begin restoration of roadways that were impacted by the project the week of October 27, 2008. Gioioso’s paving subcontractor, P.J. Keating, will begin in Raynham by setting frames and grinding on King Philip Street near Mill Street and proceed to Route 138 and then north on Route 138 to Turnpike Street in Easton and West Bridgewater to the Brockton city line. A full listing of streets is included in the table below. The contractor anticipates the work will take approximately three weeks to complete, weather permitting. Once pavement restoration is complete, the contractor will finalize other clean up and restoration activities, such as landscaping. “There are always impacts from a major, regional infrastructure project such as this one and we have greatly appreciated the patience and understanding of residents and businesses in the project area as we implemented this complex construction project,” said Aquaria general manager Alfredo Andrés.

Aquaria has roadway restoration agreements with each of the communities where construction took place. There are some areas where water transmission main construction took place that Aquaria will not be responsible for restoring roadways. These include areas where construction either took place off the roadway or the community agreed to release Aquaria from its obligation, because the community prefers to perform the work under its own program. Aquaria will provide financial assistance if the community will do the work. Any private

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property that was affected by the construction project will be fully restored once the roadway reconstruction has been completed and this work will be done by Aquaria’s contractor. The following table lists streets where construction took place and indicates the status of the restoration agreement and who will be responsible for the work. Areas of intersecting streets that were impacted by Aquaria’s construction will also be restored.

The contractor will attempt to maintain two lanes of travel, whenever feasible, during paving operations. If the contractor is not able to maintain two lanes of travel, a traffic pattern of one alternating lane of travel will be implemented. The contractor’s work hours will be 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Police details will be present to direct traffic during the contractor’s work hours. Should a detour be necessary, the contractor will coordinate this with the Police Department and post signs marking the detour route.

The Aquaria Water Pipeline Project constructed a 16.5 mile long, 20-inch diameter water pipeline that extends from the Taunton River Desalination Plant in Dighton through the City of Taunton and Towns of Raynham, Easton and West Bridgewater, connecting to the City of Brockton’s municipal water system. To date, Brockton and the Town of Norton have contracted to receive water from Aquaria Water, LLC; however, several other communities have

expressed an interest in purchasing water. The project will enhance the region's water infrastructure and substantially increase the water supply in Southeastern Massachusetts.
